Falls, accidents, and sports-related injuries are the most frequent causes of dental trauma with an estimated prevalence of 30%. Patients can present with varying injuries ranging from crown and root fractures to injuries to the supporting periodontal structure, including luxations and avulsions. Treatment is often complex, time consuming, expensive, and requires multidisciplinary approaches such as endodontic and periodontal treatments, surgery, orthodontic movements, and esthetic coronal restoration. Root resorption and ankylosis are the most common sequelae causing a major clinical challenge due to the high risk of infraposition and undeveloped alveolar bone. During this two-part course, new approaches for prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of traumatized teeth, including decoronation are discussed by Dr. Cohenca and illustrated using advanced 3D technology for diagnosis and treatment planning. He also reviews the latest revised guidelines based on current evidence-based literature supporting therapeutic modifications as well as new philosophies to be considered for the future.

9 am-12 pm • Endodontic Management of Pulpally Involved Immature Teeth • 3 CE • Fred Barnett, DMD • Maintaining the health of dental pulp in teeth of developing children is critically important for the longevity of those teeth, and for the maintenance of the alveolar process. When such teeth become pulpally involved, whether from trauma or dental caries, prompt recognition and appropriate management are critical for their long-term success and survival. During this evidence- and case-based presentation, Dr. Barnett reviews both vital and non-vital pulp management of the involved permanent immature tooth. Vital Pulp Therapy (VPT) is discussed (apexification/apical plug and regeneration/revascularization). Upon completion of this lecture, participants should be able to properly diagnose the pulpally involved immature tooth; understand necessary procedures to optimally manage such teeth; recognize the different materials used in the management of such teeth; and understand the biological reactions of VPT and NVPT.

1:30 pm-3:30 pm • Treatment of Compromised Teeth: What is Possible • 2 CE • Bob Grover, DDS • In traditional dentistry, tooth extraction was considered a last resort, but the advent of dental implants has challenged this notion. Implants offer excellent functionality and aesthetics, although issues like peri-implantitis and patient sensitivities highlight the complexity of implant procedures. In "Evidence-Based Decision Making in Dentistry," Drs. Rosen, Nemcovsky, and Tsesis stress the importance of conserving natural dentition. Deciding whether to preserve compromised teeth or opt for extraction and implant replacement presents a dilemma. The challenge lies in maintaining a compromised tooth for the long term, necessitating careful decision-making by both clinician and patient. The AAE recognizes implants' transformative potential, but questions the trend of replacing compromised teeth with implants early on. In 2014, the AAE issued a treatment guide covering various compromised tooth scenarios, yet lacked a detailed explanation of long-term outcomes. Drawing from over three decades of experience and analysis of thousands of cases, Dr. Grover showcases treatment possibilities and outcomes for compromised teeth. Using the AAE's guide as a foundation, Dr. Grover analyzes cases to shed light on evolving treatment modalities and their impact on long-term dental preservation.

4:00 pm-5:00 pm • Lessons Learned From Endodontic Follow-ups: Which Teeth Survive? • 1 CE • Bob Grover, DDS • Evidence-based dentistry prioritizes patient preferences, emphasizing a pain-free, functional, and aesthetically pleasing dentition. Patients generally prefer retaining natural teeth over implants, provided their survival rate matches that of implants. Current endodontic research shows a high success rate for treatments, whether measured by disease resolution or tooth retention, but many studies only observe outcomes over the short term – typically 1-5 years. Most patients are concerned with the long-term retention of their teeth. Curious about the variations he noticed in the survivability of endodontically treated teeth in his practice, Dr. Grover embarked on a project to ascertain the long-term survival rates of endodontically treated teeth, along with identifying which teeth are more likely to survive and the primary causes of endodontic tooth extraction. In this lecture, Dr. Grover reviews the relevant outcome literature and its implications for private practice: addresses the various cases of endodontic tooth loss: examines the significance of literature on endodontic extractions: investigates factors influencing the survival of endodontically treated teeth; discusses potential interventions to enhance tooth survival rates; and compares endodontic outcomes using conventional vs. minimally invasive endodontic techniques.
