# 2026 FAE Fall Forum Speaker Program

9-10 am - The Root of it All: Building Teams that Stay, Thrive and Grow | Melanie Clark | 1 CE

In this keynote presentation, Melanie shares practical strategies for creating a workplace culture that attracts and retains exceptional team members, strengthens leadership and fosters long-term success. 10:30 am-12:30 pm - Non-odontogenic Orofacial Pain in the Endodontic Practice | Dr. Divya Kohli | 2 CE

Endodontists are often the first specialists to evaluate complex dental and orofacial pain. While many cases are odontogenic in origin, a significant number are non-odontogenic pain conditions that mimic pulpal or periapical disease. Failure to recognize these entities can lead to misdiagnosis, unnecessary treatment, and persistent pain. Dr. Kohli specializes in identifying and managing these complex cases, focusing on distinguishing between odontogenic, musculoskeletal, and neuropathic pain. By preventing unnecessary treatments and strengthening collaboration with orofacial pain specialists, attendees can avoid misdiagnoses and help patients achieve lasting relief.

12:30-2 pm - Lunch & Learn: From Pankey to the Microscope: A Restorative Journey Toward Saving More Teeth | Dr. Osvaldo "Ozzie" Mayoral\* | 1 CE (includes a delicious buffet lunch)

You are already doing a good job with composite fillings, but let's take this to the next level. In this lecture, Dr. Gammichia disrupts common thinking. For instance, not crowning post-endo teeth and all teeth with cracks. What about teeth with deep decay dangerously close to the pulp, or a tooth that breaks multiple cusps? What about large restorations that are also deep? Do teeth that are broken to the gumline have to be crowned? Dr. Gammichia shows attendees that pathologically conservative dentistry can successfully, and profitably, restore heavily compromised teeth for decades. 9-10:30 am - Beyond the Textbook: Problem-Solving Strategies in Endodontic Microsurgery | Dr. Thanos Fasoulas | 1.5 CE | TRACK A

Success in endodontic microsurgery requires the ability to adapt to non-routine clinical situations. In this course, Dr. Fasoulas guides attendees through advanced strategies for managing unpredictable, non-textbook cases. Challenges like sinus proximity and perforation, instrument and silver point retrieval, calcified canals, and surgery involving anatomically complex teeth or regions are analyzed through case-based discussions. The role of hybrid and advanced flap designs to enhance soft tissue healing and access are explored. Emphasis is also placed on identifying cases requiring guided bone regeneration (GBR), particularly in the presence of apicomarginal defects or cemental tears. Attendees gain practical, predictable strategies for managing unexpected complications while maintaining surgical precision. Speaker Sponsor: ClaroNav

9-10:30 am - The Coronal Conundrum: The Biomimetic Solution to Restorative Endodontics | Drs. Davey & David Alleman | 1.5 CE | TRACK B

What is the silent killer of most endodontic treatment? Coronal leakage: Endodontically treated teeth are the most structurally compromised and susceptible to fracture and decay. Common restorative techniques fail to regain the biomechanics and structural integrity lost during treatment cycles. Crowns and fillings allow for microleakage, reactivation of decay, and reinfection of root canal treated teeth. Can additional tooth structure be preserved? Can microgaps under restorations be prevented? Can vital teeth with deep carious lesions be sealed to maintain pulpal health? Yes – through stress reduction and biomimetic restorative dentistry. Biomimetic dentistry uses the intact tooth as the ultimate guide in reconstruction. Combining tooth conservation, stress reduction, and advanced adhesive dentistry solves the coronal conundrum of gaps, cracks, and leakage.

11 am-12:30 pm - Advanced Soft Tissue Management in Endodontic Microsurgery: Addressing the Usual Culprits | Dr. Thanos Fasoulas | 1.5 CE | TRACK A

Effective soft tissue management plays a critical role in the success of endodontic microsurgery, especially in achieving esthetic and functional outcomes. Dr. Fasoulas highlights the historical evolution of flap designs, illustrated through clinical cases that demonstrate their advantages and limitations. Established periodontal techniques like the VIP approach, entire papilla preservation, the coronally advanced flap, and the bilaminar technique – now increasingly embraced in endodontic microsurgery – are presented with focus on their ability to prevent scar tissue formation and prevent or improve gingival recession. Emphasis should be given on techniques for tissue elevation, manipulation, and reapproximation, as demonstrated through a wide array of clinical examples. Dr. Fasoulas underscores how soft tissue and periodontal considerations, once overlooked in endodontic surgery, are now vital for achieving predictable, long-term, and esthetically pleasing outcomes. **Speaker Sponsor: ClaroNav**

11 am-12:30 pm - The Black, White and Gray of Crack Management | Drs. Davey & David Alleman | 1.5 CE | TRACK B

Cracks into dentin, the third most common dental pathology, are commonly undiagnosed, ignored, or mistreated. Drawing on both dental and engineering research from recent decades, predictable crack treatment is now possible, conserving tooth structure, resolving symptoms, and protecting pulp vitality long-term. Attendees learn how to assess a tooth's risk for cracks or other structural compromise, how to identify and remove cracks in a way that offers predictable outcomes that are asymptomatic and protect the tooth's long-term vitality, and how biomimetic restorative dentistry can prevent cracks in cases they treat.

2-3:30 pm - Decoupling With Time to Overcome the Hierarchy of Bondability | Drs. Davey & David Alleman | 1.5 CE | TRACK B

Restorations can fail as composite shrinkage exposes teeth to reinfection, loss of tooth structure, and higher stresses. The solution: Decoupling with Time. Dr. David Alleman developed this concept while researching protocols for improving bond strengths to dentin. Advancements in adhesive dental materials now give practitioners the ability to create bonds to dentin that mimic that of a natural tooth's connection to itself, but why do patients still experience post-operative sensitivity and debonded restorations? Variables in substrate and prep design can greatly decrease bond strengths, but decoupling with time brings predictability to challenging restorations, creating bonds that last for over 20 years.

2-5:30 pm - The Applications of Piezosurgery in Endodontics Workshop | Dr. Thanos Fasoulas | 3.5 CE | 15 maximum attendees | TRACK A

Piezoelectric devices have revolutionized surgical workflows in dentistry, offering unmatched precision, safety near critical structures, and enhanced control. In endodontic microsurgery, where accuracy and tissue preservation are paramount, the use of piezoelectric surgery represents a significant advancement over conventional surgical handpieces. In this hands-on workshop, Dr. Fasoulas explores the advantages of piezo surgery, including its impact on surgical outcomes and wound healing. Special attention is given to the bony lid technique and its implementation.

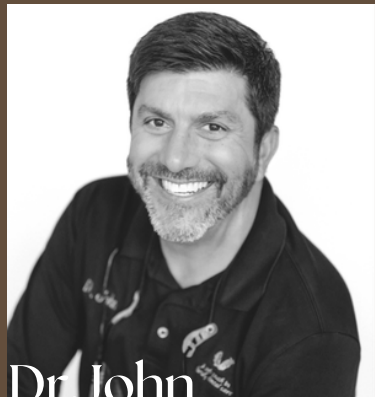
